For the information of Chicago, JOHN HENRIK CLARKE, a Negro, 45 years of age, currently resides with his wife and children at 223 W. 137th St., New York City.


He has been an Associate Editor of Freedomways Magazine of 799 Broadway, New York City, for a number of years. This publication is self-described as a Quarterly Review of the Negro Freedom Movement.

In the late 1960's, for a period of several years CLARKE was also Director of the African Heritage Program of Haryou-Act at 181 West 135th St., New York City. The "New York Times" issue of 10/28/64, page 46, column 1, describes Haryou-Act as a Harlem Youth Project formed by the merger of two organizations, Harlem Youth Opportunities Unlimited and Associated Community Teams. The Times article said the aim of this Harlem project was to attempt an improvement of the status of underprivileged youth.

As of January, 1969, CLARKE was, in addition to the employments set out above, also the Secretary-Treasurer of M.X. Associates, book publishing, located at 223 West 137th St., which address is the same as the subject's address.

As of August, 1970, CLARKE was no longer affiliated with Haryou-Act, but was determined to be a Professor of Black and Puerto Rican Studies at Hunter College located at 68th St. and Park Avenue, New York City. This employment, of course, was in addition to the other two specified above.

CLARKE is currently on the Security Index of the New York Office.



CLARKE was interviewed by Bureau Agents at New York on 1/10/62. In the course of his remarks at that time he said he had made a trip to Cuba at the behest of a cultural committee in Cuba, which had sponsored the trip for various writers and journalists. CLARKE indicated that all his expenses for this trip were paid. He indicated that he was not approached by anyone to write pamphlets or brochures regarding racial conditions in the United States for eventual publication in Cuba.

CLARKE additionally stated that he had never belonged to the CP at any time. He said he had been a subscriber to the "Daily Worker" but could not recall the year although he pointed out that his subscription was only for a limited period of time. The "Daily Worker" was an East Coast Communist newspaper. CLARKE went on to say that he did not read the "Daily Worker" because of his liking for Communist philosophy, but rather because on many occasions there were good articles in the paper which were contributed by various Negro writers. CLARKE went on to say he has attended meetings of practically every type of political group but does not have any allegiance to any particular group.

In response to questioning, CLARKE indicated that he had no inclination to cooperate with the Bureau or with any other Government agency. He indicated that he did not want to become involved as he was much too busy trying to make a living. The interviewing agents on this occasion, based on the results of the interview and CLARKE's attitude, felt that he had no potential value from the standpoint of becoming a source or an informant.

CLARKE has now been fully identified.



No further action is being taken concerning CLARKE with respect to the tenuous allegations concerning him which were made available by This case is being maintained in a Closed status in the New York Office.



#### I. BACKGROUND

#### A. Residence

On June 2, 1971, a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) using a suitable pretext, determined that CLARKE resides at 223 West 137th Street, New York, New York.

#### B. Employment

The First Quarter, 1971, Volume II, Number 1 edition of the magazine, "Freedomways", lists JOHN H. CLARKE as an Associate Editor of that publication.

The official publication of Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, which was set up by the Communist Party, USA (CPUSA) in New York City in 1961 is "Freedomways".

During a National Board meeting of the CPUSA in 1961, it was stated "Freedomways" developes theory and criticism of currents in the Negro movement and projects a socialist and pro-Soviet orientation to these matters.

On May 11, 1971, NY T-2 advised that CLARKE is a professor of Black and Puerto Rican Studies at Hunter College, 68th Street and Lexington Avenue, New York, New York.

On June 2, 1971, a Special Agent of the FBI using a suitable pretext, determined that CLARKE is Secretary-Treasurer of the Malcolm X Associates Book Publishing, 223 West 137th Street, New York, New York.

MALCOLM X LITTLE was the Head of the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated and the organization of Afro-American Unity (OAAU) who was murdered in New York City on February 21, 1967.

Characterizations of the Muslim Mosque, Incorporated and the OAAU are set forth in the appendix pages of this report.

### C. Travel

On April 8, 1971, a review of the records of the Passport Division, United States Department of State, Washington, D. C. reflected that one JOHN HENRIK CIARKE, 223 West 137th Street, New York, New York, was issued passport number B475639 on March 26, 1971. CIARKE listed his date of birth as January 1, 1915 at Union Springs, Alabama. CIARKE indicated he would depart New York, New York on April 8, 1971 by air for a one week conference in Germany.

On June 2, 1971, a Special Agent of the FBI using a suitable pretext, determined that CLARKE had recently returned from a visit to Europe.

D. Criminal Record

The records of the Security and Investigation Section, of the Intelligence Division, New York City Police Department (NYCPD) were caused to be searched by Special Agent AUGUST J. MICEK in May, 1971 and no information identifiable with CIARKE was developed.

II. OTHER ACTIVITIES

A. Meetings Attended

CIARKE was the main speaker at a meeting of the Militant Labor Forum held at 873 Broadway, New York, New York on February 2, 1968. CIARKE was introduced as the Editor of "Freedomways" magazine. In his speech, CLARKE discussed the history of a Negro culture in glowing terms and condemned the American culture.

NY T-3 February 5, 1968

Militant Labor Forums are public forums sponsored by the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) and are held Friday evenings at 706 Broadway, New York, New York.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

CLARKE was in attendance at a memorial meeting for W. E. B. DU BOIS sponsored by "Freedomways" and held on February 23,1968 at Carnegie Hall, New York, New York. There were approximately 1,800 people present at this meeting and all praised the lifework of Doctor DU BOIS.

NY T-4 February 28, 1968

NY 97-2204 W. E. B. DU BOIS was a self-admitted member of the CPUSA who is deceased. CIARKE was in attendance and spoke at the 25th Anniversary Commemoration of the Warsaw Ghetto Uprising. under the sponsorship of the American Federation for Aid to Polish Jews, held April 21, 1968 at the Manhattan Center, New York, New York. CLARKE in his speech condemed "Hitlerism" and stated that it still exists today. NY T-5 April 23, 1968 The American Federation for Aid to Polish Jews guards and promotes the interests of Polish It is controlled by Communists and is sponsored by the "Morning Freiheit", described as a Yiddish Communist newspaper. The "Morning Freiheit" of April 23, 1968, page 1, contained an article dealing with a "Ghetto Memorial Meeting", held April 21, 1968 at the Manhattan Center, New York, New York. The article reflects that JOHN CLARKE, Editor of "Freedomways", was one of the guest speakers and that he received a warm reception from the audience. A characterization of the "Morning Freiheit" appears in the appendix pages of this report. NY T-6 advised on September 9, 1970, that JOHN H. CLARKE was in attendance at one or more sessions of the Congress of African Peoples held September 3 - 7, 1970 at Atlanta, Georgia. NY T-6 on September 9, 1970, also furnished a letter on the stationery of the Congress of African Peoples which reflected that JOHN H. CLARKE would conduct a "Workshop" on History at this Congress. - 5 -

NY T-7 on September 11, 1970 advised that CLARKE was in attendance at one or more sessions of the Congress for African Peoples held September 3 - 7, 1970 at Atlanta, Georgia / NY T-7 further stated that at this Congress, one RICHARD HENRY, President of the Republic of New Africa (RNA), New Orleans, Louisiana, prepared a list of names which he identified as "the Black Liberation Army Contact List of all Revolutionary Black International People." HENRY talked to these individuals when they visited a reception room of the RNA and indicated that the RNA is interested in furthering relationships with these individuals. The name of one JOHN CLARKE, New York City, was on this list.

A characterization of the RNA appears in the appendix section of this report.

The Congress of African Peoples held September 3 - 7, 1970 in Atlanta, Georgia, has been publicly described as an exchange of Black Power Conferences held in 1966, 1967 and 1968 in the United States and in 1969 in Bermuda, all of which attracted thousands of black people. The ideology expressed during the Congress was Pro-Africanism described as a working relationship between blacks in America and those on the Continent of Africa. Under this theory both economic and political institutions would be established to deal with the problems of blacks. The Congress closed with a call for the formation of a black political party under the banner of Pan Africanism.

NY T-8 advised on October 19, 1970 that JOHN H. CLARKE was in attendance at a "Black State Reception and Dinner" sponsored by the Congress of African Peoples for African leaders and delegations to the United Nations held on October 16, 1970 at the Hotel Pierre, New York, New York. There were approximately 200 - 250 persons present at this affair.

Various speakers spoke after the dinner at this reception and all called for the unity of black people.

NY T-9 on November 9, 1970, advised that the Political Liberation Workshop Council 25, of the Congress of African Peoples held a meeting on November 7, 1970 at 502 High Street, Newark, New Jersey. At this meeting a list of individuals who were selected at the Congress of African Peoples held September 3, 1970 in Atlanta, Georgia, as representatives from a workshop, was passed out. This list also includes the individual's respective workshop affiliation. Included on this list was one JOHN H. CLARKE, 223 West 137th Street, New York, New York, with workshop affiliation listed as "History".

#### C. Miscellaneous

NY T-10 on July 8, 1968 made available a pamphlet captioned, "MALCOIM X, the Man and his Mission", written by JOHN HENRIK CLARKE. This pamphlet traces the life of MALCOIM X from his birth to his murder.

NY T-10 on July 3, 1968, made available a pamphlet captioned, "The Afro-Americans in New York City in a Lecture on the Making of Harlem - the World's Most Famous Ethnic Community", by JOHN HENRIK CLARKE. This pamphlet traces the history of New York City and Harlem from colonial days to the present time.

Other sources familiar with certain phases of Communist Party activities and related matters in the New York City area were contacted in May, 1971 and could furnish no information identifiable with CLARKE.

#### D. Description

#### APPENDIX

#### REPUBLIC OF NEW AFRICA

A source advised in May, 1970, that the Republic of New Africa (RNA) is an all-Negro organization founded in Detroit, Michigan, in March, 1968. ROBERT F. WILLIAMS, who was then residing in Peking, China, was named as its President-in-Exile. After fleeing the United States in 1961 following the issuance of a local warrant in North Carolina on a charge of kidnapping growing out of a racial incident, WILLIAMS published and broadcast hate-type material in Cuba and China prior to his return to the United States in September, 1969. Shortly after his return, WILLIAMS resigned from RNA.

A second source has advised that the purpose of the RNA is to establish an independent black nation within the United States, demanding the States of Alabama, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, and South Carolina, in addition, to pay \$10,000 per black citizen as payment for 400 years of ancestral slave labor.

A third source advised on March 14, 1969, that an army of the RNA, known as the Black Legion, dedicated to black freedom and committed to the concept of systematic armed revolution, has been established. Black Legion members are expected to participate in military training and engage in firearms practice. The RNA plans to establish an underground Black Legion in addition to an aboveground Black Legion in order to avoid detection by the police.

According to this source, Black Legion members acting as bodyguards at a session of the Second National Convention of the RNA in Detroit, Michigan, on March 29, 1969, were involved in a shoot-out with members of the Detroit Police Department which resulted in the killing of one policeman and the critical wounding of another.
