RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

A review on December 27, 1966, of the personnel records, Federal Records Center, St. Louis, Missouri, indicated that PAULI MURRAY was employed on October 9, 1935, as a Teacher with the Work Project Administration, at Manhattan, New York. This employment was terminated on September 18, 1936, as a Teacher, by reason of resignation to accept outside position.

She was employed on May 4, 1937, as a Teacher Grade "T.C." with the Work Project Administration, at Manhattan, New York. This employment was terminated on July 23, 1939, as a Teacher by reason of, "Removal required by law - 18 months continuous employment."

She was employed on June 14, 1966, as a Consultant, on a per diem basis, with the United States Department of Labor, Office of the Secretary, Office of the Assistant Secretary for Labor Standards, at Washington, D.C. This employment was terminated on July 13, 1966, as a Consultant, by reason of expiration of appointment and completion of work assignment.

Her address in February, 1939, was shown as 225 West 110th Street, Manhattan, New York; was listed in May, 1937, as 40 Morningside Avenue, Manhattan, New York, and in June, 1966, as 245 East 11th Street, New York, New York.

No other employment records were located at the Federal Records Center.

Honorable WILLIAM H. HASTIE, U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals, Federal Building, 9th and Market Streets, advised on December 30, 1966, at one time he had been Dean of the Law School at Howard University in Washington, D.C. During this period the applicant had been a student at the law school and had been the best student the law school had ever had. He had known applicant daily during this period which ended in the early 1940's. Since that time his acquaintance with the applicant has been limited to casual, infrequent visits; however, he has heard about her through writings and other sources.

About three years ago, he spent approximately a week in contacts with her while she was teaching at the Law School, University of Ghana in West Africa and was very pleased with the very skillful manner in which applicant presented to her law students the principles and ideals upon which the United States Government was founded. Something, according to Judge HASTIE, particularly difficult to do since the students were members of an almost complete totalitarian government. He described the applicant as being a very loyal person, extremely hardworking and intense, an able attorney, and capable in all endeavors. He qualified this by stating he did not know how she would be in an administrative position, but believed applicant to possess a great deal of drive and initiative.

Judge HASTIE advised he would recommend the applicant highly for a position of trust with the U.S. Government.

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

U. S. Civil Service Commission informed that in connection with previous information, [redacted] who is listed as a reference for applicant, previously informed she had taught at the Southern School for Workers for a period of three weeks in the summer of 1937 and from 1937 until the school became inactive, she allowed her name to be included in its advisory committee. During the period the school had its office in Richmond, Virginia, [redacted] participated in one or two institutes held in Richmond.

In connection with another inquiry in April 1952, RH [redacted] who is not available for recontact, advised that the Southern School for Workers was dissolved as of January 20, 1951.

Informant related it was his opinion this organization was not run or controlled by the Communist Party (CP) nor were any of its members. Informant further related there was no political cooperation between the Southern School for Workers and the CP. Informant stated that there had been from time to time certain individuals temporarily affiliated with the school about whom he had had some doubts as to their loyalty to this country, but that the school itself and its principal participants were definitely not CP members nor sympathetic with the CP.

Informant pointed out that frequently the aims of the school might parallel with the aims of the CP with respect to a particular issue such as housing, poll tax, etc., but that the position of the school on any of these issues had nothing to do with Communist ideology.

RH [redacted] informed on January 17, 1942 the Southern School for Workers originated in about 1928 and operated in various places in North Carolina until about 1940. Informant stated the purpose of this school was to teach Trade Union members how to conduct union meetings, how to put on entertainments, study parliamentary procedure, study public speaking, economics, hygiene, English and union organizational tactics.

RH [] related on February 17, 1951 that during the 1938 - 1939 sessions, the school was ostensibly held in the interest of educating members of labor unions in the southern part of the United States, but these sessions were actually under the direction of the CP and were used as a "sounding board for possible recruits into the CP". This informant also stated these sessions were utilized as a means for distributing CP documents at that time.

[redacted] added that PAULI MURRAY has returned to Los Angeles on visits since her employment by this company and has stopped by the office to pay a visit. [redacted] stated that she has met PAULI MURRAY and considers her to be a very brilliant person but stated that she did not feel qualified to comment about PAULI MURRAY. [redacted] said that the only person still associated with the company who would remember PAULI MURRAY is [redacted]

[redacted] of the Los Angeles Sentinel Publishing Company, 1112 East 43rd Street, Los Angeles, California, advised on December 27, 1966 that PAULI MURRAY formerly worked on the newspaper for a few months during World War II as a reporter. [redacted] stated he remembers PAULI MURRAY very well and that he considers her to be honest, trustworthy, reliable and dependable. He stated PAULI MURRAY enjoyed a good reputation when she was associated with this company. [redacted] said that he has no reason to question the loyalty of PAULI MURRAY to the United States. He stated that he would recommend her for employment in a position of trust. In conclusion, [redacted] said that he knows no derogatory information concerning PAULI MURRAY. He said that PAULI MURRAY has spent her adult life as an attorney in Washington, D. C. and New York City.

She stated she considers the employee to have a very fine character and reputation and to be a very honest, trustworthy and dependable individual. The employee is extremely industrious, very talented and creative in her occupational field. She is very amenable and sociable. PAULI MURRAY is very interested in Civil Rights, the personal rights of women and the Negro, having very firm personal convictions in these areas, and as a result she has irritated certain people and made a few enemies. [redacted] advised that she knows the employee more as a close business acquaintance than as a personal friend and, therefore, she is not acquainted with the employee's close personal friends. She considers the employee to be a loyal American and recommends her for a position of trust and responsibility with the United States Government.

RESULTS OF INVESTIGATION

EDUCATION

On December 19, 1966, [redacted] Yale University Law School, (YLS), 127 Wall Street, New Haven, Connecticut, advised that MURRAY entered September 18, 1961 and received a JSD degree June 14, 1965. The title of her thesis is "Re-examination of the Roots of Racial Crisis as a Guide to Social Policy".

She stated that while there, MURRAY had the title of Senior Fellow and this gave her a small stipend to aid in her living expenses and also for her tuition. In return she did some tutoring at the school.

[redacted] stated that she recalled the applicant with a favorable impression as being a refined individual. She was always cheerful and appeared to be the type who would always exchange the "pleasantries of the day". She appeared to be competent and was well regarded at the school. She stated that she never had any reason to question her moral character, associates, or loyalty to the United States. She recommended her for a position of trust and confidence.

[redacted] on December 19, 1966, advised that he was personally acquainted with the applicant. He stated that she was extremely able, wholly honest, and a loyal American. He stated that she was intelligent and virtuous. He stated that while working towards her JSD degree, she carried the title of Senior Fellow and worked with first year graduate students and did some assistant teaching as to first year law students, thus she had faculty status. He stated she performed well in all aspects of her association with the law school. He recommended her for a position of trust and confidence.

He stated that she was extraordinarily able, gifted, gracious, and still eager and ambitious to seek her own betterment. He stated that she possesses "tremendous character", is above reproach, and "not a leftist". He stated she is a loyal American citizen. He stated she has "no unfavorable tendencies". He recommended her highly for a position of trust and confidence.

On December 19, 1966, [redacted]

[redacted] of Law and Legal History,

advised that the applicant was a very determined person, one who, notwithstanding her age, and the fact she is a member of a minority group, is still intensely interested in advancing herself in life. She is competent, personable, honorable, and refined. While at Yale she worked on her particular field of legal interest, mainly, the Negro, civil rights issues and allied fields. He never knew her to be an outspoken critic of the United States and/or its administration. She believed that much was being done for the Negro and that yet more had to be done.

To his knowledge her only associates were members of the Law School "family". He did not know of her to have any extensive circle of friends outside the school. He was aware of nothing unfavorable regarding MURRAY. He recommended her for a position of trust and confidence.

On December 19, 1966, [redacted]

related that she was acquainted with MURRAY during the time she was at Yale. She described her as possessing a dynamic personality, aggressive, honest and yet compassionate. She knew of no associates outside of the members of the Yale faculty, their families, and possibly some unrecalled graduate students.

COX

She stated MURRAY was vitally interested in the history of the Negro movement within the United States, the various laws, how they affected the Negro, and how new legislation could better affect the Negro as a whole. She could not be considered a radical, left wing, or in opposition to the administration of the United States. She recommended her for a position of trust and confidence.

On December 19, 1966, [redacted]

[redacted] stated she had been acquainted with MURRAY during the four years the applicant was there. She always found her to be a lady. She was quick-witted, intelligent, and understanding. [redacted] felt that MURRAY, although extremely interested in her race and their history and plight in this country and lack of advancement, never lost sight of gains being made of late in civil rights matters. The applicant had tremendous drive and always indicated a desire to "make something out of this world". MURRAY indicated an intention to achieve a place of prominence for herself, but based on her ability. This was one reason for her working towards a JSD degree.

She knew nothing unfavorable regarding MURRAY and recommended her for a position of trust and confidence.



On December 22, 1966, Mr. THOMAS I. EMERSON, Augustus E. Lines Professor of Testamentary Law, stated that he was closely associated with the applicant during her time at Yale. He served as her thesis advisor. He saw MURRAY frequently, academically as well as socially as a guest in his home. Mr. EMERSON described the applicant as being: "very capable, a hard worker, morally sound as a dollar, responsible, and trustworthy".

He advised that she has worked hard during her lifetime to obtain a place of prominence for a member of her race. He stated she has traveled extensively. She worked in Ghana, taught school there and wrote a book dealing with the constitutional law of that country. However, she left Ghana when she fell out of political favor with one of its political leaders.

He advised that recently he was telephonically contacted by [redacted] of the Equal Employment Opportunities Commission, Washington, D.C., relative to MURRAY and her forthcoming position as general counsel with that agency. He stated that [redacted] is also a former student of his. He highly recommended MURRAY to [redacted] for a position at that time.

[redacted] advised that he has met the applicant's brother and two sisters. Further, that when MURRAY received her JSD degree, her relatives were overnight guests of the EMERSONS'. He recommended her for a position of trust and confidence.

LOUIS F. BUDENZ, self-admitted former member of the Communist Party (CP), USA, advised in 1950 that he was advised by JACK STACHEL in 1944 or 1945, then a member of the National Committee of the CP, that THOMAS I. EMERSON was a hidden member of the CP.

NH [redacted] advised on March 16, 1950, that THOMAS I. EMERSON was close associate of Communism, an opinion which he formed through personal contact with EMERSON in the late [redacted] and through an analysis of EMERSON's speeches and writings (X)

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THOMAS I. EMERSON, in an affidavit prepared in January of 1953, stated: "BUDENZ' statement that I was a member of the Communist Party is absolutely and unequivocally false . . . I am not now and never have been a member of the Communist Party -- card-carrying, concealed, or otherwise".

In an affidavit prepared by EMERSON in December of 1952, he stated: "I do not now support, and never have supported, the Communist movement (although actions taken by me for other purposes may have incidentally been consistent with positions also taken at the time by Communists or their supporters); . . . my position has always been that of an independent liberal, and I have never been willing to have any person or group determine my stand on questions of public policy."

On February 27, 1962, NH [redacted] advised [redacted] (X) U

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[redacted] at Detroit, Michigan. A pamphlet entitled, "National Lawyers Guild @ Silver Anniversary Convention * 1962," contained therein a listing of officers and members of the NLG from July 1960 through February 1962. Among those listed as Vice President of the NLG during that period of time was the name "THOMAS I. EMERSON, Connecticut."

The April 13, 1964 issue of the "New York Times", a New York City daily newspaper, on page 23, contains an advertisement of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee announcing a meeting of that
