Additional Information:

Founded in 1969 by graduate students from Washington University in St. Louis, as a leftist collective to sell counter-culture books and literature, generally unavailable at other local retail store. Titles especially featured feminist and anti-establishment themes. Originally opened on the Delmar Loop, it moved to its current location in the Central West End in 1977. The store remodeled and expanded in 1988. As of 2017, the store is co-owned by Kris Kleindienst and Jarek Steele.

Described in Damron guides as a bookstore selling gay / lesbian titles, records, and tapes.

LBB has hosted a variety of famous Americans, even former U.S. Senator and presidential candidate, Hillary Clinton.¹

Store co-owner Jarek Steele notes, "It is queer owned and operated and has always carried a diverse selection of books, striving to represent subjects and communities that are often under-represented elsewhere. We had the first (and only) women's studies, LGBT and African American sections in the city."²
