

#### FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE (FPCC)

The April 6, 1960, edition of "The New York Times" newspaper contains a full page advertisement captioned, "What Is Really Happening in Cuba," placed by the FPCC. This advertisement announced the formation of the FPCC in New York City, listed various sponsors of the Committee and declared the FPCC intended to promulgate "the truth about revolutionary Cuba" to neutralize the distorted American press on Cuban affairs.

"The New York Times" edition of January 11, 1961, reported that at a hearing conducted before the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on January 10, 1961, Dr. CHARLES A. SANTOS-BUCH identified himself as one of the organizers of the FPCC. Also, Dr. SANTOS-BUCH identified ROBERT TABER as a co-organizer of the FPCC and said TABER drafted the aforementioned FPCC advertisement. Dr. SANTOS-BUCH further testified that he and TABER obtained \$3,500 from the Cuban Government through the son of Cuba's Foreign Minister, which funds, along with about \$1,100 collected from supporters of the FPCC, paid for the cost of aforementioned advertisement in "The New York Times".

On October 3, 1960, a source advised that the Socialis' Workers Party (SWP) in New York had become active in the FPCC, and that SWP members, in a recent FPCC election, had been able to remove several Communist Party members who were on the Executive Board of the FPCC and gain control of the organization. This source asserted that the SWP members believed that they had achieved a great influence in the course of the Cuban revolution through their control of the FPCC.

On February 10, 1961, a second source advised that PHIL BART, National Organizational Secretary and member of the National Committee, CP, USA, had reportedly stated recently that the FPCC had been captured by the Trotskyites, but that the CP had not given up in the FPCC.

The SWP and the CP, USA, have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

#### FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE (FFCC)

The April 6, 1960, edition of "The New York Times" newspaper contains a full page advertisement captioned, "What Is Really Happening in Cuba," placed by the FPCC. This advertisement announced the formation of the FPCC in New York City, listed various sponsors of the Committee and declared the FPCC intended to promulgate "the truth about revolutionary Cuba" to neutralize the distorted American press on Cuban affairs.

"The New York Times" edition of January 11, 1961, reported that at a hearing conducted before the United States Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on January 10, 1961, Dr. CHARLES A. SANTOS-BUCH identified himself as one of the organizers of the FPCC. Also, Dr. SANTOS-BUCH identified ROBERT TABER as a co-organizer of the FPCC and said TABER drafted the aforementioned FPCC advertisement. Dr. SANTOS-BUCH further testified that he and TABER obtained \$3,500 from the Cuban Government through the son of Cuba's Foreign Minister, which funds, along with about \$1,100 collected from supporters of the FPCC, paid for the cost of aforementioned advertisement in "The New York Times."

On October 3, 1960, a source advised that the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) in New York had become active in the FPCC, and that SWP members, in a recent FPCC election, had been able to remove several Communist Party members who were on the Executive Board of the FPCC and gain control of the organization. This source asserted that the SWP members believed that they had achieved a great influence in the course of the Cuban revolution through their control of the FPCC.

On February 10, 1961, a second source advised that PHIL BART, National Organizational Secretary and member of the National Committee, CP, USA, had reportedly stated recently that the FPCC had been captured by the Trotskyites, but that the CP had not given up in the FPCC.

The SWP and the CP, USA, have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On September 12, 1961, the latest issue of "Freedomways", which is the summer 1961 issue, is self described as "a quarterly review of the Negro Freedom Movement" published by Freedomways Associates, Incorporated, 799 Broadway, New York City. Page 151 of this issue comments that they are planning a discussion on "Negro leadership and organizations" in the next issue of "Freedomways". The article comments that one of those who will prepare articles for this forthcoming issue is JOHN HENRIK CLARKE.

A review of the "African Heritage" issue of December, 1959 reflects that CLARKE wrote articles containing background information on the city of Timbuctoo, the Emperor of Morocco, 1641-1727, and the Empire of Ethiopia. The "African Heritage" issue of December, 1959 also reflects that CLARKE was a member of the African Exposition Staff which exposition was held at the Coliseum, New York City, during August 6 through 15, 1959.

A review of "The American Negro Writer and His Roots" reflects that this publication was published by the American Society of African Culture and contained selected papers from the First Conference of Negro Writers, March, 1959. The booklet reflects that the subject was a member of the Conference Planning Committee and wrote an eight page article entitled "Reclaiming the Lost African Heritage". This booklet also reflects that CLARKE is the author of the "Lives of Great African Chiefs", "Rebellion in Rhyme" and "The Black Christ" and other stories.

A review of the publication entitled "Tom Mboya: The World's Youngest Statesman" reflects that CLARKE wrote on the background of this African leader. The booklet also reflects that CLARKE has written over a period of time formany foreign periodicals and those of the United States as well. The booklet states that he is presently a staff lecturer on African subjects at the Center for African States, New School for Social Research. New York City.

A review of the publication entitled "Transition in the American Negro Short Story" reflects that this is an article reprinted from the Atlanta University Review of Race and Culture. In the article CLARKE comments that the Negro writer had been an oddity and a stepchild in the eyes of critics; however, since the Stock Market collapse of 1929, a new crop of Negro writers has emerged. CLARKE comments there would no longer be weepy sociological propaganda stories written by Negro writers but the material used by Negro writers. with the rise of nationalism and

independent states in Africa and the rapid change of the status of the Negro in the United States, would reflect a breaking away from the old mooring.

The records of the Secretary of State, New York State Department of State, Albany, New York, reflect that the certificate of incorporation of Freedomways Associates, Inc., was filed on March 2, 1961.

The first issue of "Freedomways," spring, 1961, is self-described as a quarterly review of the Negro freedom movement published by Freedomways Associates, Inc., 799 Broadway, New York City.

On May 25, 1961, a confidential source advised that "Freedomways" was set up by JAMES JACKSON, a member of the National Committee, CPUSA, for the CP of the United States with the approval of the CP of the Soviet Union.

On May 24, 1961, another confidential source advised that a report was given on "Freedomways" at a meeting of the National Board, CPUSA, held on May 24, 1961. It was stated that the original plan called for the publication to be openly Marxist, but that it was later decided it would not be avowedly a Marxist publication. Editorials are in the hands of a mixed group of Marxists and non-Marxists. It was stated that the central purpose of "Freedomways" is to develop a theory and positive criticism of currents in the Negro movement, as well as to raise the level of understanding and discussion taking place in Negro life today and to project a socialist and pro-Soviet orientation.

A New York Office memorandum in 1958, undocumented, disclosed that there was no information in New York Office indices at that time indicating that the New School for Social Research, 66 West 12th Street, New York City, was Communist Party-controlled or infiltrated, although there had been many allegations to that effect. Baltimore report of SA RALPH G. MURDY, dated 7/6/53, entitled "OWEN LATTIMORE, ESPIONAGE - R; PERJURY", contained a documentation of the New School for Social Research, describing it as having been "established in 1919 for the purpose of furnishing an opportunity for adults, who had completed school but desired to continue their education, to study under qualified instructors subjects in which they were particularly interested. Many persons who were associated with communists or communistinfiltrated organizations have been connected with the school. However, the faculty is predominantly opposed to communistic principles and it is neither controlled nor influenced by communists". The source of this information was shown on the administrative pages of that report merely as the report of SA NICHOLAS J. ALAGA, dated 4/29/42, at New York City, entitled "New School for Social Research, IS - C", Bufile Number 65-6656.

The only other significant reference in WFO indices regarding the NSFSR was shown to be located in New York Office File Number 100-21281-6. The information was regerved by SA J. S. JOHNSON on 4/14/41. The source was described as "Letters of S. V. CONSTANT, Lt. Col., G.S.C., Executive Officer, G-2, dated 4/10/41". This source, who had furnished reliable information in the past, advised that "the New School for Social Research was founded in 1933 as a haven for European educators (communists) exiled by ADOLPH HITLER". On October 27, 1961, Reverend ASHBURN advised SA that he has known CLARKE since 1948 and visits him about once every year or so at 311 West 136th Street, New York City. CLARKE was born in Alabama and is approximately 45 years of age.

Reverend ASHBURN stated that CLARKE told him that he joined the Communist Party (CP) in the 1930s but broke with them and left the CP in 1942 and went into the service. CLARKE left the CP because he felt that they were using the Negro race to further their own ends and were not doing anything for the Negro as such.

Reverend ASHBURN stated that after leaving the service, CLARKE went back into writing and is a "worker for the uplift of mankind".

Reverend ASHBURN advised that CLARKE quit NBC to write and he is presently giving a lecture course on African studies at a college connected with the state of New Jersey somewhere near New York City.

Reverend ASHBURN declared that CLARKE "would be a crusader if able to do it" and that CLARKE is "dedicated for the equality of everybody".

Reverend ASHBURN advised that CLARKE hates the CP with a bitter hate ever since he was disillusioned about their feelings toward the Negro. Reverend ASHBURN advised that CLARKE is interested in the Cuban situation because he feels the Cubans would win over the CP influence in the final analysis.

Reverend ASHBURN advised that he felt CLARKE would not do anything subversive, as on one occasion CLARKE said to ASHBURN "The United States is one place where a man can be free", and on another occasion told Reverend ASHBURN that if there were a war with Russia, he, CLARKE, would be the first one to get a gun to fight them.

Reverend ASHBURN described CLARKE as kind and gentle and one who is dedicated to a cause. He stated CLARKE liked to talk with Mrs. ASHBURN, who died several months ago, as she was born and raised in Africa by her missionary parents and came to the United States when she was 14 years old.

Reverend ASHBURN advised that several years ago he saw CLARKE get rid of a roommate because of the roommate's beliefs in the CP.

The CP, USA has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

On October 17, 1961,  City Service Cleaning Contractors, 1564 Broadway, New York City, advised that the subject continues to maintain his employment with them as a building cleaner.  advised that on October 16, 1961, he received in the mail a request for information regarding CLARKE from the United States Information Agency. The return envelope had the address of United States Information Agency, Washington 25, D. C., Attention: 10AlP.R. The enclosed letter contained a list of questions which had to fill out regarding GLARKE's employment, character, associates and loyalty to the United States. CLARKE was applying for employment as an Assistant Cultural Affairs Officer. The United States Information Agency letter was dated October 12, 1961 and was signed by Chief, Recruitment Branch. - 9. The Bureau's position and interest in the internal security of the US will be explained to the subject. The subject will be advised that since he has made application for a position with one of the US Government agencies, he should certainly be more than willing to cooperate with the FBI.
