On October 12, 1973, a representative of the FBI reviewed the records of the New Jersey Division of Motor Vehicles at Trenton, New Jersey. These records reflect that

b7C [redacted] He is employed at the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) 1790 Broadway, New York City, New York. On June 5, 1972, [redacted] received New Jersey driver's license number [redacted]. These records also reflect that [redacted] is the registered owner of a 1967 Cadillac automobile with New Jersey number [redacted] (Unclassified)

The October 2, 1969 late city edition of the "New York Times" sets forth on page 42 a photograph and article on Nathaniel R. Jones under the heading "NAACP Picks General Counsel". This article is hereinafter set forth:

"N. R. Jones, a 43 year old Negro Lawyer was appointed General Counsel of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People yesterday.

"Mr. Jones had served as Deputy General Counsel for the President's Commission on Civil Disorders during 1967 and 1968 and prior to that he was an Assistant United States Attorney for the Northern District of Ohio for five (5) years.

"The Lawyer told newsmen at the NAACP offices, 1790 Broadway, that 'I have faith that the (American Legal) system can be made to work (for Black people)'. He added that 'Negros across the country are victims of all sorts of injustices'.

"Commenting on the United States Supreme Court, Mr. Jones said that its decisions had been 'meaningful in unshackling the minds and hearts of Black people'.

"The Court's ruling, he noted, set up 'the underpinnings for mounting massive assaults on the bastions of segregation.'

"Mr. Jones said that while a growing polarization of the races was apparant, the NAACP 'has the organization that can provide the bridge that can keep the two societies together and prevent a split.'

The March 28, 1975 issue of the "San Francisco Examiner," a daily newspaper published in San Francisco, on Page 17 contains an article entitled "Dr. Du Bois' Advice To American Women," which sets forth an interview with Du Bois. She left her classes at the University of Massachusetts to spend Easter week in San Francisco to conduct seminars in the School of Nursing at the University of California. She recently returned from her fifth trip to China and her lectures contain her observations on the women of China, and on the parallel of black history and history of women.

Du Bois currently lives in Cairo, Egypt, and travels on a Tanzanian passport.

The April 5, 1975 issue of the "Black Panther", official weekly newspaper of the Black Panther Party (BPP) (See Appendix) on Page Three contains an article entitled "Huey Newton Is With Us." Du Bois' son, David G. Du Bois, is editor-in-chief of this newspaper. Du Bois was the guest of honor at a book party held by the BPP at the Oakland, California Community Learning Center during which she praised BPP founder Huey P. Newton. The following is the text of her speech:

"Seldom am I introduced by such a beautiful sister (Ms. Elaine Brown). I shouldn't say sister, but daughter. Thank you.

"You can imagine what a joy it is for me to be here. Not only for David. Of course I am proud of him. It is a joy for me to be here, to know that he

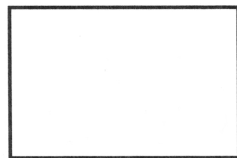

BLACK PANTHER PARTY
FORMERLY KNOWN AS THE BLACK PANTHER PARTY FOR SELF-DEFENSE

The Black Panther Party (BPP), organized in December, 1966, at Oakland, California, by Huey P. Newton and Bobby George Seale, has the publicly-stated purpose of organizing black people to take control of the life, politics and destiny of the black community. The Party, operating the Black Panther Intercommunal News Service, publishes a newspaper called "The Black Panther," which at one time openly advocated the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in a revolutionary program to end the oppression of the black people but since early 1971 has spoken for a survival program pending revolution. BPP national headquarters, also known as Black Panther Intercommunal Headquarters, is located in Oakland, California.

While openly advocating direct overthrow of the U. S. Government by force and violence until 1971, leaders have since avoided extreme statements in favor of calling for action within the established order. Newton, in an interview appearing in the May, 1973 issue of "Playboy" magazine, stated the Panthers' chief ambition is to change the American Government by any means necessary but that ultimately such change will be through armed violence.

Despite its claimed dedication to community service, indicators of the BPP's continued attraction to violence persist. Since July, 1974, Newton and other BPP members have been arrested in Oakland, California, for threatening police officers, murder of a 17-year-old female and the pistol whipping of Newton's tailor. Newton failed to appear on these charges and is now a local fugitive. Additionally, one died and three were wounded as a result of a shooting at a BPP-sponsored dance in Oakland, California, in October, 1974.

APPENDIX

LOLA GRAHAM DU BOIS

"So I don't have to pay tribute to him. I will just say that I know he is with us this afternoon. We can feel his presence. We can feel his presence in this beautiful music, in these young people, the hope, the joy and the work that they do.

"I feel very serious about this matter of writing. I remember that in the beginning was the word, and the word was God. Words are not regarded in the way they ought to be in Western civilization, if you can call it 'civilization.'

"But I feel that these three writers are responsible. They don't use words carelessly. When they use words, they feel a responsibility. They know that when they use words, they are taking upon themselves something that is divine. They use words to communicate to others, to all hearts and all minds, that which is meaningful to them.

"How carelessly words are used in these United States! How words are degrading! What kind of words are thrown out on the TV, on the radio and in the theater? Words that degrade human beings. But these writers have given you words that live. I am so happy to be here to greet these writings.

"I am not capable this afternoon of making a speech I am just giving you a few words that come from my heart -- that I am very happy to be here and I do want this school to succeed. We use words carelessly. I am not making this wish carelessly. I am going to put my pocket-book where my mouth is. I am going to help a little bit. Thank you."

LOLA GRAHAM DU BOIS

"is contributing, working in such a school as this, which is really, but what I have seen, simply thrilling. I am proud of him for that.

"I am proud of him because he is the editor of the Black Panther paper, and I am proud to be here this afternoon to welcome his first book. Really, that's an awful lot for any mother to be proud of.

"But I want to say something else which I feel very deeply this afternoon. You know, our loved ones are with us. Who can sit in this room this afternoon and not feel the presence of Huey Newton? How true was the song sung by your beautiful Elaine. We do not know what he is going through, but we know that he is here with us.

"We're celebrating not just David's and Ericka's books. Huey Newton is with us this afternoon, so completely. His words are with us, but he is with us too. I feel it very keenly, and I am honored to be here in this room with him.

"There have been a few things said about him and all were beautiful remarks. But I want to add just a little tribute to this young man who dares to be free, he DARES to be free. What an inspiration that is.

"He is recognized not only in this country, but in Africa and in China. I know that he lives in Africa, and I know that he lives in China.

"You know, there are Black Panthers in other parts of the world, fashioned after the Black Panthers here at this moment. I am not even going to name the places where they are. It might not be too good for them. Why are there Black Panthers in other parts of the world? Because of Huey Newton.

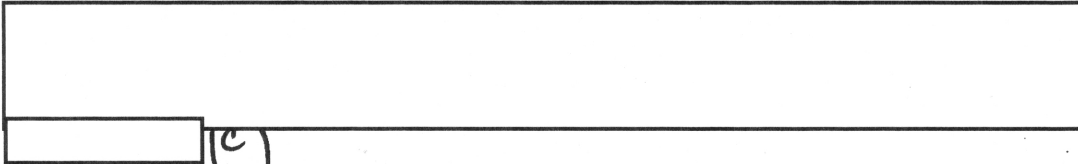

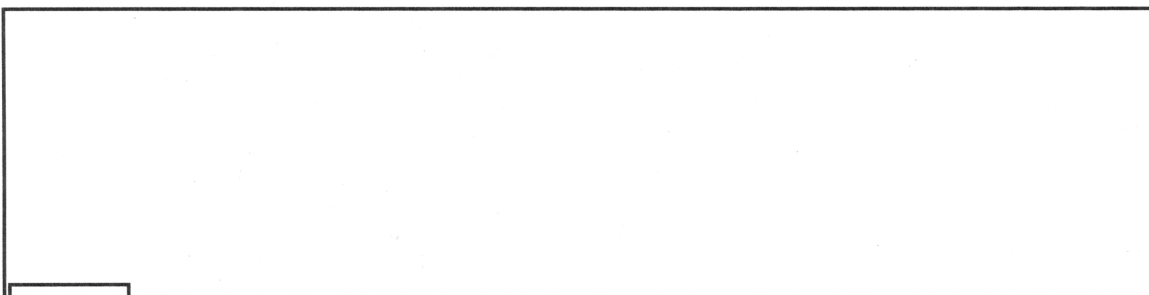

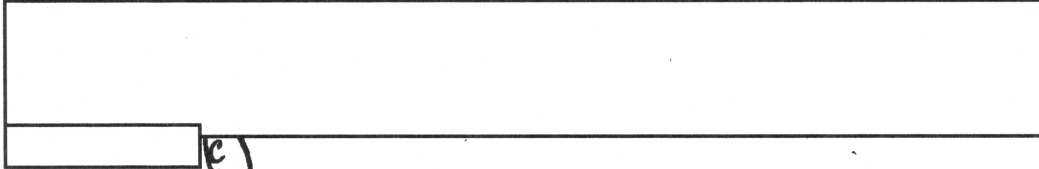
